PRESS RELEASE

State Attorney Ginger Bowden Madden announces that on July 16, 2021, in Escambia County, Florida, Circuit Court Judge Coleman Lee Robinson sentenced Jacquavious Savage to fifteen years in State prison followed by ten years of probation.

Savage was sentenced following a plea of no contest to six cases, involving eleven felony counts and two misdemeanor counts. The charges included: Grand Theft of a Firearm, Grand Theft Auto, Burglary of an Unoccupied Conveyance, Attempted Burglary of an Unoccupied Conveyance, Grand Theft, and Petit Theft.

These cases arose from a three-day criminal spree in which Savage and his co-defendants entered five different neighborhoods and apartment complexes to steal and burglarize multiple vehicles.

Between October 27, 2019 and October 30, 2019, Savage burglarized four cars, attempted to burglarize a fifth car, stole three cars, a firearm, and various other property items from the cars.

Savage juvenile record includes seven prior felonies and eleven prior misdemeanors, with charges ranging from: Delinquent in Possession of a Firearm, Fleeing and Eluding, Grand Theft Auto, Burglary, and other offenses.
